 **READ: Matthew 13:1-8, 17-23; Mark 4:26-29; 1 Corinthians 3:6-7**


 **WRITE:** Are you equipping yourself daily to sow seeds of truth into the lives of others? If not, what changes would need to take place in your heart to motivate you to invest in the lives of those you encounter?
